Training in skating schools

Children and young people are divided into small groups according to their skills. Each group has its own trained instructor.

Teaching takes place in a positive and encouraging atmosphere.

We learn the basic skills of skating: standing up, falling safely, skating forward and backward, sliding, braking, etc. We use a variety of tools and games to help.

Once the basic skills are in place, we will progress in the training towards different movements and combinations of figure skating.

During the season, there are various theme lessons, such as a teddy bear lesson and, if possible, a time with a parent and a seasonal party.



Insurense

We insure all skating school children under the age of 15 with the Finnish Figure Skating Association's skating school passport. To obtain insurance, we need the skater's ID number.

The skating school insurance is valid for skating schools and related ancillary activities organized by the STLL member club.

The club does not insure people over the age of 15.

However, everyone should take care of insurance coverage. Comprehensive accident insurance for your figure skating hobby. It is worth checking the insurance conditions that the insurance covers figure skating.

Instructions for parents

Skates

Good and proper skates are the most important prerequisite for learning to skate.

With the sturdy skate, you can stand on one leg and jump evenly without twisting the ankle. If the skate does not support the foot, skating will be difficult, and the feet will hurt.

Don't buy room for growth. Skates that are too big do not support the foot enough. The appropriate size is usually the same as the size of the child's winter shoe. In addition to the operating sock, a thin sock can fit inside the skate.

Tying skates

- Start tying from the bottom
- At the foot and ankle, the straps are tied tightly.
- The rest of the skate is looser so that the two fingertips fit between the skate and the foot.
- Shorten straps that are too long, do not tie them around the ankle.

Skate care

- Blade guards should be used when transporting ice skates on foot outside the ice.
- After skating, remove the guards in the locker room and dry the blades with a towel.
- Skates should be stored separately in cloth bags without blade guards to prevent the blades from rusting.
- Figure skates should be sharpened by an expert who will sharpen the skate. Figure skates have a different sharpening than hockey sticks.

Clothing

A good skater's outfit on the ice is flexible and warm. Thick quilted clothing makes it difficult to move. A better option is a tracksuit or fleece outfit.

The ice is cool, so a beanie and gloves are necessary. Please check that the clothes do not carry sand on the ice.

The use of a helmet is recommended for small children and beginners.

Instructors use a marker pen to draw patterns on the ice. Traces of the marker can be left on the clothes if the skater falls over the drawings. Please take this into account when choosing clothes.

The skater will be given a name tag at the skating school reception for the first-time skating. Skaters always wear a name tag on their chest during skating class.

The locker room may be congested, so take care of your own equipment.

The club is not responsible for lost or damaged items during the skating school. It is good to name the clothes.

At the ice rink

Come to the hall about 15 minutes before class starts.

The skating school reception is at the entrance to the ice rink. Please register every time!

The instructor prepares for the lesson about 5 minutes before the start of the lesson, when the reception closes.

Do not go on the ice before the instructors. Eating jars and candies is strictly prohibited. Instructors help children from the exchange to the ice.

Skating school groups have their own colors. Each skater and coach keep their own group ribbon on the skate. Attach the strap over the footrest to the straps. Based on colors the skater and instructors identify their own group. They also make teaching easier for younger children.

Escorts, such as parents, can follow the flow of ice in the halls where the auditorium is located. Adequate safety clearances must be provided in auditoriums. The skaters are taken to an ice rink exchange where the instructors are facing them.

Avoid walking and being in a change box, as the sand that enters the shoes will damage the blades.

Billing for the period 2022–2023

- Membership fee 30 euros. The membership fee paid from all participants once a school year > in the autumn is also valid in the spring.
- Skating school pass for children under 15 11 euros
- These have been invoiced same time as the invoice for skating school

Development groups and competition groups

Our instructors actively monitor children's development on the ice. Interested and enthusiastic skaters have the opportunity to advance into competitive development groups. We will also be adding new skaters to our development teams in the middle of the season.

- The Tintit group is the first step towards competition groups. Tintit, children are 4-6 years old and practice twice a week.
- The MikroMints team is the first step for those interested in synchronized skating. The skaters are 5-8 years old and train 2-3 times a week.
- YL Diamonds is a group for those interested in single skating. YL Diamonds are 5–7 years old and have rehearsals 3-4 times a week.
